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**No cyclone warning is in force in Mauritius.**

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**Twenty third and last cyclone bulletin for Mauritius issued at 08h00 hours on Friday 28 February 2025.**

Based on the recommendation of the National Crisis Committee, the cyclone warning for Mauritius is being waived.

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However, cloud bands associated with **Garance** will continue to influence weather over the island with showers that may become moderate to heavy at times with isolated thunderstorm. These showers may cause temporary water accumulations and flooding in certain places.

Wind will blow from the northern sector at about 40 km/h with gusts of the order of 80 km/h.

Sea will be very rough with swells of 5 to 7 metres beyond the reefs. Storm surge will cause coastal inundation along low lying coastal areas mainly to the north and the west. It is strictly advised not to go out at sea and to avoid venturing along beaches.
