<b>UAE</b>	All ports are operational with some restrictions. The Fujairah Oil Tanker Terminal (FOTT) is currently operational, as confirmed by the latest update from port authorities. In response to a significant increase in cargo calls resulting from the rerouting of vessels, Oil Tanker Berths No. 4 (Bulk Cargo) and No. 5 (Edible Oil) have been designated to enhance cargo handling operations and alleviate berthing congestion. The present estimated waiting period for berthing is a minimum of four weeks for breakbulk, bulk, general cargo, and roll-on/roll-off (Ro-Ro) vessels. Additionally, both Vopak Terminal and ADNOC SPM Terminal remain operational.</li> <li>• The Khor Fakkan Container Terminal, in view of the notable increase in cargo calls, has all six berths fully operational and specifically allocated for container cargo. The estimated waiting period for berthing remains at least 4 weeks for breakbulk, bulk, general cargo, and Ro-Ro vessels. Discharge operations for general cargo and containers are proceeding as scheduled at both the Fujairah and Khor Fakkan Terminals without any disruption. Anchorage services continue to operate normally and without interruption.</li> <li>• Jebel Ali, Hamriya, and Sharjah Port, all terminal port operations are normal.</li> <li>• Khalifa Port Terminal's port operations are normal.</li> <li>• STS operations are resumed in Dubai waters anchorage with tug assistance; each operation will be assessed separately. No underway STS is permitted till further notice.</li> <li>• Ruwais and Abu Dhabi petroleum ports are operational. Ruwais PPA (ISPS level 2) &amp; Abu Dhabi Ports (ISPS Level 1). Abu Dhabi Ports confirmed that all UAE ports it manages and operates remain fully open and are operating as usual.</li> <li>• Ras Al Khaimah Ports remain open and are operating normally.</li> <li>• Dubai International Airport has resumed operations at 90% capacity.</li> </ul>	03/07/2026 - 08:30

All other ports: ISPS Level 1	Open	• Airspace is open.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Current Status: All ports are fully operational.</li> <li>• The Sultanate of Oman has issued a Notice to Mariners that sets out a temporary, coordinated traffic management plan for vessels transiting the Strait of Hormuz due to heightened safety risks. At a high level, it establishes that Oman, working with the IMO and regional partners, is introducing controlled and phased vessel movements using temporary routing corridors, as the normal Traffic Separation Scheme is currently considered unsafe. Ships will be grouped, scheduled, and individually instructed on when and how to transit, with requirements to wait in designated holding areas, maintain communications, and follow strict navigation and safety protocols. The aim is to reduce collision risk, maintain safe flow of traffic, and ensure continued freedom of navigation during a period of elevated operational risk.</li> <li>• Vessels calling at all Oman ports must submit an official letter stating that they are not carrying any dangerous Goods on board. If any dangerous Goods are found, the type of cargo must be specified in detail, and the vessel must await the Ministry's approval before entering Omani territorial waters.</li> <li>• The Following notification was received from the Mina Al Fahal terminal (Crude Oil) loading facility. All vessels scheduled to call at MAF are to ensure their Doppler log is fully operational. This precaution is necessary due to ongoing GPS interference in the area. Vessels without a functioning Doppler log cannot be berthed due to safety requirements.</li> <li>• All ports are ISPS Level 1.</li> <li>• Airspace remains open.</li> </ul>	02/07/2026 - 08:00
